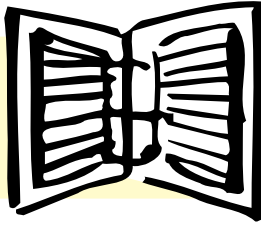

3. Spencer is visiting France. She has €500 at the beginning of her trip, and once she gets home to Hayward, California, she has €185 left. How much did she spend in American dollars? How much money does she have left in American dollars (round to the nearest dollar)?

4. Dustin has \$12 USD. He is visiting Australia and finds a book that he wants to buy. The book costs \$15 AUD. Does he have enough money to buy the book? If not, how much more US money does he need (round to the nearest dollar)?

5. Lucy has €50. She wants to purchase a dress for \$30 CAD and a pair of shoes for \$25 CAD. After her purchases, how many euro will she have left (round to the nearest euro)?
